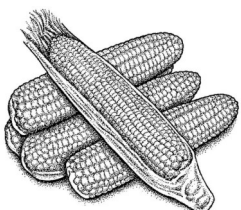

Kultursaat is a non-profit plant breeding organization that contributes to the further development of agrobiodiversity in order to promote biological diversity. Kultursaat started the project in 2003 and Super Sweet SH2 was the result of a crossing of 40 SH2 hybrids. It is the only open pollinated SH2 variety that we know about from which you can save seed and will reliably reproduce.*

## **REID—YELLOW DENT** 100-110 day

*In the mid 1800s, Robert Reid accidentally crossed "Gordon Hopkins," an old dent variety, with an early Native American flint*

*called "Little Yellow." This "mistake" is the base of some of the most widely used genetics in corn production today.*

## **REVOLT 105 DAY** (cycle 0) Synthetic

A synthetic is a composite of a number of inbred lines that you can save seed from. Work on this synthetic population began in 2003. Its parents were older inbreds that formed strong hybrids and its adaptation is the northern part of the Corn Belt. Has Ga1s traits (see below for more info).

## **REBELLION 110 DAY** (cycle 0) Synthetic

This synthetic population began as some preliminary crosses among commercial and university corn belt dent inbred lines in 2003. This was crossed with the Ga1s carriers from Missouri as part of this project. It is likely adapted to the central Corn Belt.

*Ga1s are naturally occurring traits in corn that will greatly reduce outcrossing with plants that don't carry the same trait. This trait is called gametophytic incompatibility. This trait helps prevent accepting unwanted pollen from transgenic and other field corn. This is how much of the popcorn stays pure. Revolt and Rebellion are varieties with the Ga1s trait. They were developed by Dr. Frank Kutka and the Seed We Need Project with support from a grant from the Organic Farming Research Foundation. We appreciate Frank's fascinating work.*

- No hulls to remove. Most oats have a clinging hull that requires expensive milling equipment to use them for human consumption. Hulless oats do not. In fact, hulless oats, like wheat, shed the hulls easily during the normal threshing process.
- Higher digestibility and protein for feed than common oats with a hull
- Medium straw

There is no comparison in corn bread made with the O.P. corn versus hybrid corn. You can carry the ears in your arms like stove wood.
